The plan will impact 3 sites of ancient natural woodland as well as beautiful countryside. Stoke Park Woods will be hemmed in by housing on all sides. Sites of Nature Conservation Interest will be affected. 6 miles of footpath & bridleway will become roads or routes through housing estates.

The new road will go in that gap, from Winchester Road in Fair Oak, across to Allbrook, across an SSSI.
